

Cincinnati Children's

OVERVIEW

<u>Cincinnati Children</u>'s is a nonprofit, comprehensive pediatric health system. As a leader in research, education, patient care, advocacy and innovation, Cincinnati Children's is ranked #1 in *U.S. News & World Report*'s 2023-2024 list of best children's hospitals in the nation and is the #2 recipient of pediatric research grants from the National Institutes of Health. Cincinnati Children's is internationally recognized for improving child health and transforming delivery of care.

SIZE

Cincinnati Children's is comprised of two hospital locations (Burnet and Liberty), a dedicated mental health campus (College Hill), as well as primary and specialty care clinics, urgent cares, and ancillary services at more than 50 sites throughout the region. **Total registered beds number 762, including 140 inpatient and**

TEACHING

Through an academic affiliation dating to 1926, Cincinnati Children's comprises the Department of Pediatrics at the <u>University of Cincinnati College of Medicine</u> and is ranked the **#3 pediatric program** at a U.S. medical school (*U.S. News & World Report*). The nearly 100-year relationship has resulted in numerous joint endeavors, including the performance of basic and clinical research, collaboration in the care of patients, cooperation in education and training of medical students, doctoral students, residents and fellows, and arrangements for the joint use of facilities and equipment. The Burnet campus is adjacent to the campus of the University of Cincinnati Medical Center, the country's first teaching hospital.

PATIENT CARE

Patients from all 50 states and dozens of countries have come to Cincinnati Children's to receive care. From July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022, Cincinnati Children's cared for children in more than 1.6 million patient encounters, including more than **1.4 million outpatient visits**, **168,000 emergency and urgent care visits** and **31,000 admissions**. Care provided includes <u>HealthVine</u>, a network of pediatric care providers and organizations that connect to help children be healthier, more effectively and affordably. HealthVine assumes accountability for the delivery of care management and utilization management functions for about **120,000 Medicaid-covered children** currently enrolled in CareSource who reside in eight counties of Southwest Ohio.

Recognized as one of the best places to work, Cincinnati Children's is the region's second largest employer with over **18,500 employees**, including more than **4,000 nurses** and **1,900 active medical staff**.

RESEARCH

Cincinnati Children's is one of the preeminent pediatric research institutions in the world. The Cincinnati Children's Research Foundation is the health system's research arm and the umbrella organization under which the Department of Pediatrics stands. Founded in 1931 through an endowment from William Cooper Procter (chairman of the hospital's board of trustees and grandson of William Procter, the cofounder of Procter & Gamble Co.), the Research Foundation has served as a hub for top scientists who have redefined pediatric health through their remarkable record of discovery.

Notably, in the 1950s and '60s, doctors at Cincinnati Children's were the first to develop a functional heart-lung machine, a crucial step toward open-heart surgery. Researchers at Cincinnati Children's developed the oral polio vaccine, an innovation that has nearly eliminated the crippling disease worldwide. These invaluable contributions were just the beginning of a long and distinguished history of scientific discovery.

With more than **1,000 faculty researchers**, Cincinnati Children's is the #2 recipient of NIH grants and funding for pediatric programs. In 2022, the Research Foundation secured **\$283 million** in external funding and **\$21.5 million** in philanthropic gifts and published **more than 2,400** peer-reviewed journal articles, book chapters and other publications.

Partnerships are another way we provide patient care beyond our hospital campuses. Examples of these include the University of Kentucky Children's Hospital (Joint Heart Program), and Parkview Health (Indiana) where we collaborate on trauma, general surgery, cardiology and gastroenterology.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Cincinnati Children's delivered \$425.4 million in community impact services in fiscal year 2021, including more than \$200 million in charitable patient care, \$131 million in research, \$69 million in health professionals' education, nearly \$15 million in community outreach programs and \$9 million in subsidized health services.

Hospital leadership has made a commitment to measurably improve the health of local Cincinnati children and reduce disparities in underserved populations. Strategic priorities include effective local partnerships to reduce infant mortality and prematurity, improve kindergarten readiness and third-grade reading, and address the social influences of health in the local (Avondale) community. Additionally, more than **1,000 employees are enrolled as Volunteer Ambassadors** and represent Cincinnati Children's regularly in community engagement.



RECOGNITION

Cincinnati Children's is <u>#1 in the nation</u> among all Honor Roll hospitals in U.S. News & World Report's 2023-2024 Best Children's Hospitals list and is #1 in Ohio and #1 in the Midwest.

The Best Children's Hospitals list also includes national rankings across 10 pediatric specialties. Cincinnati Children's has been named in the top 10 of each of these specialty areas, including being ranked #1 in four areas:
